- Not allowed in parks
- Must have lights after dark
- Max speed 15 mph

MOTORIZED SKATEBOARDS

- Allowed on sidewalks and paved trails
- Not allowed in parks
- Max speed 15 mph
- Not allowed after dark

City reviews 2026–2030 Capital Improvement Plan

Lenexa's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) guides the City's investments in major infrastructure — from streets and trails to public facilities and stormwater systems. The Lenexa City Council is reviewing which projects to fund over the next five years as part of the 2026–2030 CIP process.

A public hearing on the proposed plan was held Dec. 16, and the City Council will consider final approval at its Jan. 6 meeting. The CIP outlines the best available five-year plan based on current information, though project timelines, budgets and details may adjust as conditions change.

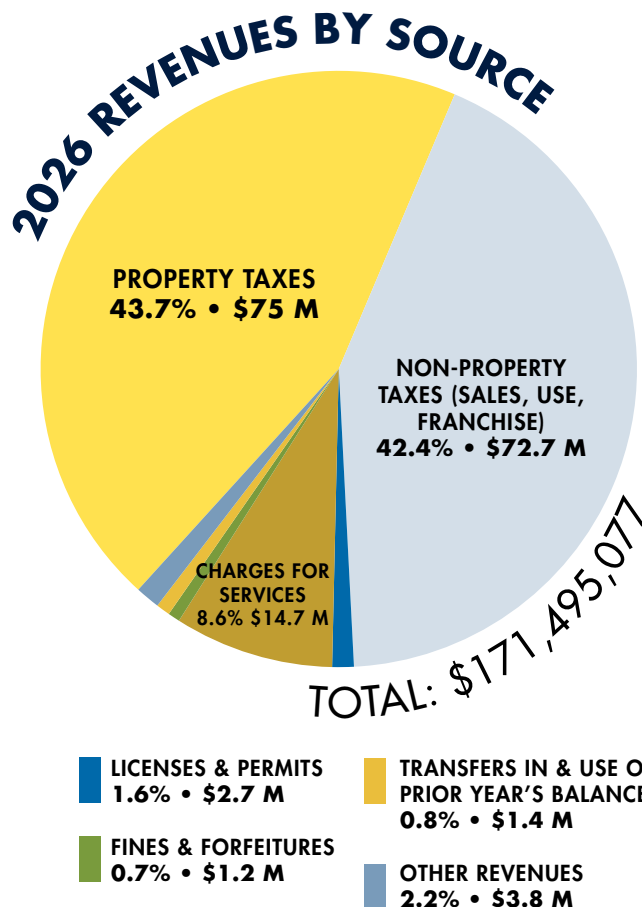
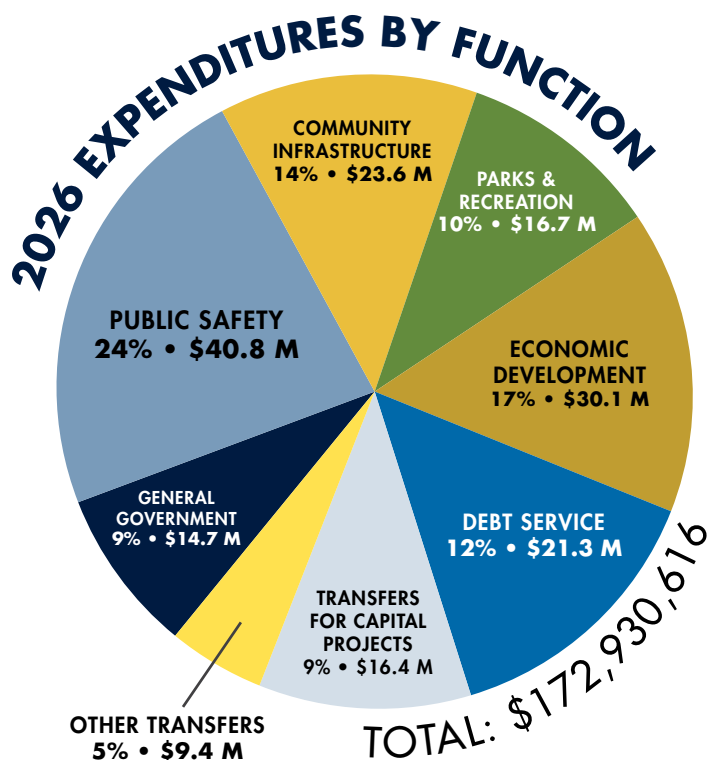
2026 BUDGET INCLUDES LOWER MILL LEVY

The City of Lenexa's 2026 budget, approved last September, marks the **eighth straight year of lowering the property tax rate**. The new mill levy is 26.234 — a reduction of 0.725 mills from 2025. That means for every \$100,000 of home value, residents will pay about \$301.69 in City taxes per year, or \$25.14 per month. If you live in a home with the average Lenexa home value of \$493,287, your monthly expense for City services is \$124.02.

Citizen Survey

LENEXA SOARS ABOVE THE REST

Every two years, we survey our residents to assess citizen satisfaction with the delivery of major City services and to help us determine the community's priorities as part of our ongoing planning process.

In fall 2025, 835 residents participated in the most recent survey — well above the goal of 600 responses. This large sample size provides a high degree of accuracy, with results precise to within $\pm 3.37\%$ at a 95% confidence level.

Once again, Lenexa residents expressed satisfaction levels that exceed both the Kansas City metropolitan area and national averages. According to ETC Institute, which conducted the survey, "Over the past 25 years, the City of Lenexa has demonstrated a remarkable commitment to maintaining and enhancing the quality of its services. Survey results show sustained excellence across core areas such as public safety, overall services and community image. Consistently high satisfaction levels reflect the City's dedication to service delivery and continuous improvement." 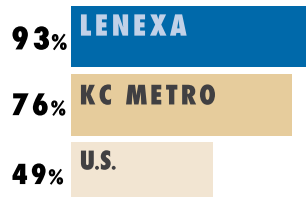

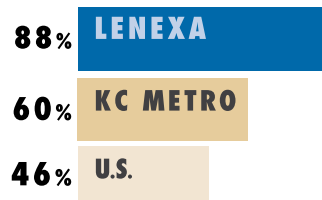

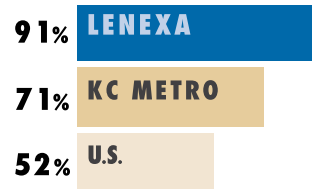

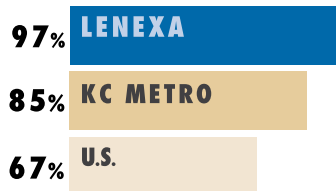

HOW QUICKLY POLICE RESPOND TO EMERGENCIES

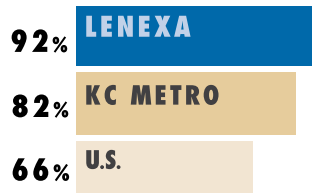


QUALITY OF FIRE AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

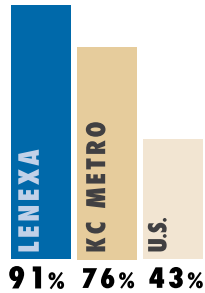
HOW QUICKLY FIRE AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES RESPOND TO EMERGENCIES

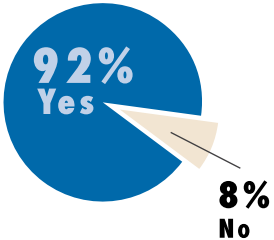

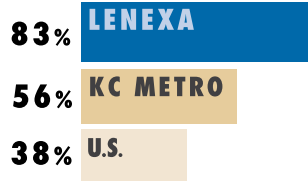

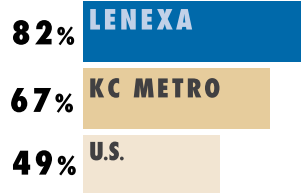

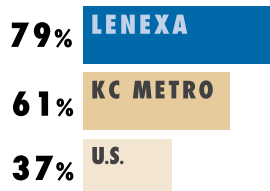
QUALITY OF THE CITY'S STORMWATER SYSTEM (STORM DRAINS, PIPES, CULVERTS, STREAMS)

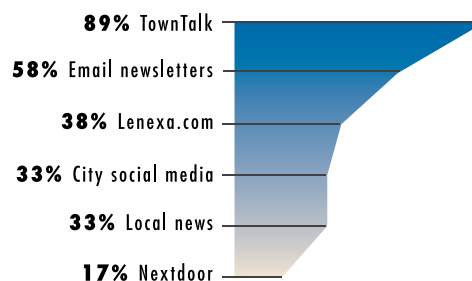

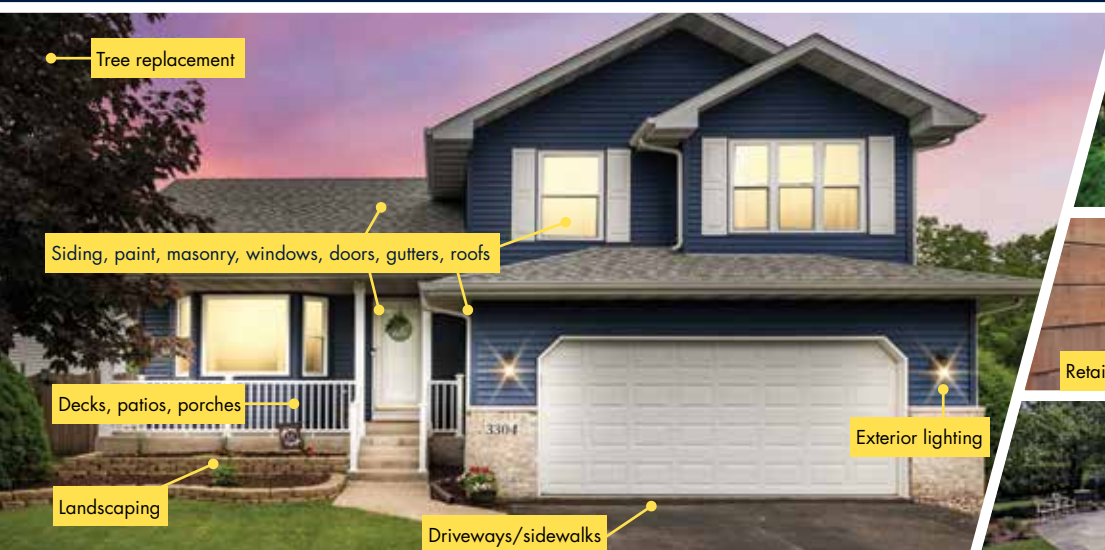

Exterior Grant Program APPLY MARCH 2–APRIL 15



The City of Lenexa's Exterior Grant Program helps owners of older residential properties to invest in improvements to assist with needed repairs and strengthen existing neighborhoods. You're eligible if your home was built in or before 1977 and is county-appraised at or below \$366,000. Homeowners must invest at least \$2,500 and are eligible for a 50% reimbursement up to \$5,000.

How to apply

Application packets must include:

- A completed application form. Download the PDF at Lenexa.com/ExteriorGrant.
- Bids from a contractor, or, if you're doing the work yourself, a detailed project cost estimate.
- Proof of current homeowners insurance.
- Color photos of the areas where you are proposing to make improvements.

Applications must be submitted to City Hall by mail or in person between March 2 and April 15. City staff will review submissions and notify everyone who applies of preapproval or denial by mid-May.

Selection process

Applications are prioritized based on property age, condition, neighborhood enhancement and whether a housing voucher is accepted. If you've applied in the past but weren't awarded funds, you can apply again.

You must be preapproved before starting work on improvements, or you will not be reimbursed. A limited amount of funds are available each year.

In the last five years, this program has awarded over \$300,000 to homeowners, which has spurred more than \$900,000 of exterior investments into homes.

Renters' rights and responsibilities

Lenexa has a residential rental licensing and inspection program to ensure that all rental homes and apartments meet minimum property maintenance and safety standards.

As part of the program, every licensed rental property receives an exterior inspection every two years. During this process, a City inspector may attempt to speak with tenants to learn if there are any property maintenance concerns — for example, loose handrails or unstable stairs that could pose a safety risk.

If code violations are identified during the inspection, the City will notify the property owner or manager. Depending on the nature of the violation, tenants may also be notified.

In addition to exterior inspections, the City may also perform interior inspections in certain situations — for example, if there is lack of heat during winter months, poor or non-functional plumbing, or unresolved pest or rodent infestations.

Tenants should first work with their landlord to resolve these concerns and document their communication. If satisfactory repairs are not made, the renter can ask the City to perform an interior inspection by filling out the form at [Lenexa.com/RentersRights](https://lenexa.com/RentersRights).

The City of Lenexa does not have the ability to interfere with your lease or other contractual obligations even if violations exist. We can only require an owner to bring the property into compliance with City codes. If you have any questions or concerns, call Community Standards at 913.477.7500. Smoke alarms with radioactive material



Many older smoke alarms use a small amount of a radioactive substance called americium-241. It emits tiny particles that create a small electric current. When smoke enters the detector, it

blocks the current, sounding the alarm.

This radioactive material is safely sealed inside the smoke alarm, so it won't harm you, as long as the alarm is not damaged.

How to throw it away the right way

Even though the amount of radioactive material is minimal, it's still important to dispose of it properly. If your smoke alarm contains americium-241, you can recycle it locally. Please schedule a drop-off time with Johnson County Household Hazardous Waste appointment scheduler at [HHWScheduler.JoCoGov.org](https://www.hhwscheduler.jocogov.org).

If your smoke alarm doesn't have a label indicating it contains americium-241, it is safe to dispose of it in the regular trash.

Protecting home oxygen users: The critical role of thermal fuses

Nearly 1.5 million people in the U.S. rely on home oxygen therapy, using portable oxygen tanks to help them breathe.* If you or someone you know uses a portable oxygen tank at home, installing a thermal fuse is an important step to help prevent a small fire from becoming deadly.

A thermal fuse is placed in the oxygen tubing and is designed to automatically stop the flow of oxygen if a fire occurs. This simple device is especially critical for anyone who uses home oxygen and also smokes. In fact, a fire-related death involving smoking and home oxygen occurs every four days in the U.S.*

Fortunately, a home oxygen thermal fuse costs less than \$10 and may be covered by KanCare, the state's Medicaid program. To request one, contact your doctor, medical equipment supplier or insurance provider.

START THE NEW YEAR SAFE

Make safety part of your new year's routine! A few simple habits can go a long way toward preventing crime in your neighborhood all year long. Follow the 9 p.m. routine:

- Each night, make sure your doors are locked, garage is closed and porch lights are on.
- Remove valuables from vehicles parked in the driveway and always lock car doors.
- Use exterior lighting around your home. Well-lit areas discourage criminal activity.

These easy steps take less than a minute but can make a big difference in keeping your property and family safe in 2026.

Teaching your child to call 911

In an emergency, your child could be the one to call for help. Teach them how to dial 911, what an emergency is, and what to say once connected. Examples of emergencies include: a fire, someone choking or unconscious, or someone trying to hurt another person.

Help them memorize your home address by writing it on a piece of paper and placing it on the refrigerator. Also, since most homes no longer have traditional landlines, make sure your child knows **how to unlock and use your cell phone** to call 911. You can even practice together by walking through the steps without actually placing a call. A few minutes of practice can make all the difference.

In addition to learning about 911, identify a trusted neighbor your child could go to if needed in the event of an emergency.

Firearm safety in the home

If firearms are present in your home, and children live in or visit your household, secure storage is crucial to prevent tragic accidents. Kids are naturally curious and may find firearms even when adults believe they're hidden. Every year, preventable shootings occur because a child gained access to an unsecured weapon.

Keep firearms unloaded and locked when not in use, and store ammunition separately. Locking safes or quick-access lockboxes allows for responsible storage that still provides access for home defense.

It's also important to talk with your children about firearm safety and make sure they know to never touch a gun and tell an adult immediately if they find one.

The Lenexa Police Department offers free gun locks to residents. Stop by the Lenexa Justice Center anytime 24/7 to pick one up and help keep your home safe for everyone.

CLEAR THE SNOW: SEE AND BE SEEN

Before heading out after a snowfall, take a few extra minutes to clear snow and ice from your entire vehicle, not just the windshield. Snow piled on your roof or hood can slide or blow off while driving, creating a hazard for you and others on the road. Clearing your headlights, brake lights, mirrors and windows also improves your own visibility and helps others see you more easily. It's a simple step that helps keep everyone on the road safer during Lenexa's winter months.

Thinking about hosting or expanding for the World Cup?

START PLANNING EARLY

The FIFA World Cup 26™ is set to bring a surge of visitors, energy and economic opportunity to the region this summer, including Lenexa. The City expects a sharp rise in requests from residents, local businesses and out-of-town operators looking to participate — especially for activities outside normal day-to-day operations such as vacation rentals, commercial pop-ups and special events. Planning in advance will help avoid delays once the crowds arrive.

WHAT TO GET A HEAD START ON

The Kansas City-hosted matches won't take place until June and July, but many permits require detailed applications, safety reviews, inspections and coordination across City departments. As the tournament approaches, high demand will likely extend review times and reduce availability for venues, public spaces and inspections. To keep projects on track, start preparing now for:

- Home rental licenses if you plan to rent out homes or rooms to visitors on a short-term basis.
- Business licenses for businesses operating in commercial spaces, or home occupation licenses for businesses run out of your home.
- Commercial certificates of occupancy, including for businesses subleasing or co-locating with another business.
- Special event permits for hosting large gatherings like watch parties; temporary alcohol licensing or extension of premise licensing; or operating as a temporary pop-up vendor to sell food or merchandise.
- Park special event permits for events held in City parks that need more space than a rented park shelter provides. (Note that Lenexa won't approve any permits for June 12–July 12.)
- Food truck requirements for those planning to operate mobile food services from a vehicle or trailer.

WHERE TO BEGIN

Find guidance and application timelines on the City's website at **Lenexa.com/WorldCup**. Start conversations with staff early — especially for larger or more complex events — to understand which approvals may be required. 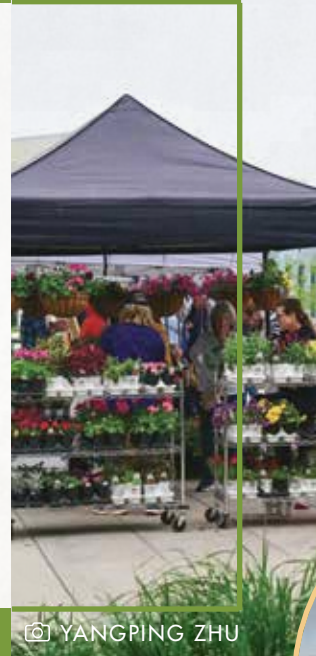

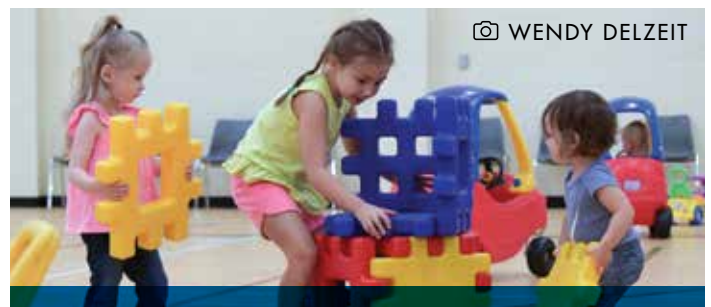
